Its time to Submit Nominations for the 2020-2021 SISL Board of Directors We have the following open positions—

President - As 2019-2020 President-Elect, Teresa Just automatically becomes President 2020-2021

Conduct business of the Club; preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board; appoint committees; be an exofficio member of committees; communicate with Region and Federation; oversee Treasurer's report to Region & Federation; plan and prepare agendas for Club meetings; know Soroptimist Laws; automatic delegate to all District, Region & Federation meetings; represent the Club in our community; demonstrate strong personal leadership and example; develop leadership in others; share responsibilities.

President-Elect—Shall automatically succeed to the presidency at the end of the President's term. Shall preside at all meetings in the absence of the President. Shall have such duties and powers as arise from the membership on the Board of Directors or as assigned by the President or the Board. Shall be the liaison between the following committees: service projects and public relations. Shall familiarize herself with all Club, District, Regional and Federation activities.

Treasurer—Shall receive all funds of the Club and deposit them in a financial institute (s) as authorized by the Board; sign all checks with the President; make remittances as required by Federation Bylaws and standing procedures; pay authorized bills; maintain a roll of membership. Shall provide monthly financial statement to members; prepare and file tax reports.

Treasurer-Elect – Shall work with and assist the Treasurer to learn the duties and functions. Shall automatically succeed to the Treasurer position the following year.

Secretary – Shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club and the Board; submit to the Club the minutes of the Club business meetings and recommendations of the Board. Shall be custodian of the permanent records of the Club. Shall handle club correspondence.

Director at Large — Assist the President with responses to forms and reports to Region and Federation. Serve as a liaison to primary chairs as President directs. Takes care of banners, flags, etc. Makes a checklist of reporting, responses, forms, etc.

Delegate (2) — The delegates to District, Region or Federation meetings will number no more than three, of which the President will automatically be one. The remaining two shall be elected by the membership. If a delegate is unable to serve at a given meeting, the President may appoint an alternate. The duties of the delegates are: to be certain credentials have been filed; registration fees and all financial obligations of the Club to District, Region and Federation have been paid. The delegates will represent the Club's position on voting matters at Federation, Regional and District levels and report results back to the Club.

Submit nominations before February 22nd. Nominations will be announced at the Business Meeting March 4th

The final slate of nominees will be emailed or mailed for you to cast your vote. Final results will be announced at the March 18th service meeting.

They were also reminded about the scholarship application for the Dream It Be It scholarship our club will award to a graduating senior planning to attend college this year.


Teresa did an excellent job presenting this subject matter to the girls. The girls participated and shared with our group. We also had a great opportunity to visit with them during lunch.

Get to the point

Your audience will be most appreciative if you keep your message brief and simple. A study shows that the attention span of humans is just eight seconds -- shorter than that of a goldfish!

Take notes

Taking notes can help you organize your thoughts and make certain you hit upon the high-level points you want to make sure you get across.

Have a good attitude

Simply smiling and being positive goes a long way. By having a positive attitude, people will want to be in your company and will pay more attention to what you are saying.

You aren't always right

When delegating information and assignments, let the person in charge make some of the decisions. If there are absolutes, let them know that ahead of time, and then let them add their personality and flare to their project. Don't hover over them. Check to see if they need help with anything or they are on track and brainstorm with them if they want you to. They make the decisions with their committee.

Remember, good Communication is the key to effective Leadership!

Each club needs to be ready to cast their ballots for Soroptimist International of the Americas President-elect.


SIA will implement its first electronic mail ballot for SIA President-elect at the end of February.
